For three-alternative positional voting and decision methods, it is shown how to decompose the profiles and data sets in a manner which identifies all possible conflict relative to a specified procedure. This approach is illustrated with the plurality vote; it is done by characterizing all possible profiles which cause all possible conflicts between the plurality and other pairwise and / or positional procedures. The approach then is used to cast doubton an often cited plurality vote property.
